

## Halloween Safety – Be Smart, Be Safe, Be Seen

Situation	This year, authorized trick-or-treating hours across the garrison is from 5 – 7 p.m. Follow these safety tips to avoid any unwanted Halloween scares! Be smart, safe and be seen.
Example	A CHILLING FACT Kids are more than twice as likely to be hit by a car and killed on Halloween than on any other day of the year.
Rules	<ul> <li>Driver Reminders:         <ul> <li>Watch for children and pedestrians in the street. Exercise extreme caution. Avoid distractions!</li> <li>Enter and exit driveways carefully. Be on alert for anyone darting out into traffic or between parked cars.</li> <li>Obey the speed limit. Consider driving under the speed limit when children are present.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Trick-or-Treat Safety:         <ul> <li>Walk on sidewalks. Reinforce traffic safety rules, to include looking both ways before crossing a street.</li> <li>Stay together as a family or group. Keep children within line of sight. Teach children to stay alert.</li> <li>On post, candy will only be given out at the bottom of the stairwells. If no station, move along.</li> <li>Carry fully charged phone. On post, report suspicious/unusual events to MPs: +49 7031-15-3102/3095.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Costume Safety:         <ul> <li>Use reflective tape on costumes and bags and carry glow sticks or flashlights to stay visible.</li> <li>All costumes, wigs and accessories should be well fitted and fire/flame-resistant.</li> <li>Use for non-toxic Halloween makeup instead of masks, which can obscure vision.</li> <li>Always test makeup in a small area first to see if any irritation develops.</li> <li>Remove all makeup before children go to bed to prevent skin and eye irritation.</li> <li>Don't wear decorative (colored) contact lenses unless prescribed by an eye care professional.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Decoration Safety:         <ul> <li>Take extra effort to eliminate tripping hazards on porches and walkways; check around the property for anything that may prove hazardous to children rushing from house to house.</li> <li>When using jack-o'-lanterns with candles, make sure they are far enough out of the way so not to catch anything on f</li></ul></li></ul>
